

## Reading Opportunities at Key Stage 1

In addition to working on termly objectives within comprehension and guided reading lessons, pupils have the following reading opportunities: -

- Reading books sent home weekly, closely matched to phonic ability
- Regularly sharing stories within English lessons - through EEF planning around a book
- Class reading libraries readily accessible
- Daily phonics sessions (small group sessions due to curriculum room rotation in Y1)
- Research tasks within Foundation subjects including using the use of IT based media
- Classroom focus activities, such as 'sound detectives' (searching through books for certain sounds/ words)
- School trips focused on reading (Seven Stories Year 1, local Library Year 2)
- Storytime every day to instil a love of reading through discussion and role play

For those children working below ARE, further opportunities to develop reading skills include:

- Small group interventions, providing additional support for phonics
- Additional lunchtime reading with an adult
- Reading with the class teacher
- Small group phonics sessions everyday
- Lexia programme
